



# CODATA Important Activities, Events and Dates 2018

As a guide to members, this document provides a summary of important activities, events and dates relating to CODATA initiatives and governance in 2018.

## Strategic Priority Areas

**Data Policy:** CODATA will build on recent outputs including *Science International Accord on Open Data in a Big Data World* <http://www.science-international.org/>, the *CODATA-RDA Guidelines for the Legal Interoperability of Research Data* <https://doi.org/10.5281/zenodo.162241> and the *OECD-CODATA Report on Sustainable Business Models for Research Data Repositories* <http://dx.doi.org/10.1787/302b12bb-en>.

- The European Commission's **Expert Group on FAIR Data** (chaired by the Executive Director of CODATA) will publish its report and action plan to make FAIR Data a Reality in September 2018.
- The CODATA **Data Policy Committee** aims to publish in September a number of draft reports or white papers on selected topics, including: 'Upstream-Downstream: Non-Profit Research Data and Commercial Innovation', 'Data Diplomacy' and a 'Model Data Policy Training Module'.

**Frontiers of Data Science:** In addition to major **conferences** and the **Data Science Journal**, the priority activity under this strategic area is to advance the **Commission on Data Standards** to address issues of interoperability and data integration in particular for interdisciplinary research areas. The initiative is now moving forward with three pilot case studies, examining the issues of data availability and interoperability in relation to infectious disease, disaster risk and resilient cities.

**Data Skills and Capacity Building:** The priority activities in this area are the African Open Science Platform project, the Schools of Research Data Science and the GO-TRAIN initiative.

- The **African Open Science Platform** project addresses a number of areas essential to building capacity in the use of data and Open Science. Information on the project's activities can be found at <http://africanopenscience.org.za/>. In addition, 2018 will see a strategy workshop (March) and stakeholder workshop (September), to prepare the next stage of the initiative.
- The **CODATA-RDA Schools of Research Data Science** are expanding. In 2018 schools will take place in Brisbane, Australia (June); Trieste, Italy (August); Kigali, Rwanda (October) and São Paulo, Brazil (December). Be sure to follow the CODATA website, lists and social media for announcements of application deadlines.
- CODATA will play a coordinating role in the **GO-TRAIN Implementation Network** <http://bit.ly/GO-TRAIN-IN> with a first task of preparing a 'manifesto' and an ambitious workplan to develop a curriculum framework for data science and data stewardship; a train-the-trainer programme; and a mechanism for endorsement and certification of training activities.

## Major Events

CODATA will convene two major conferences in 2018.

**CODATA-Göttingen Symposium** on 'the critical role of university RDM infrastructure in transforming data to knowledge', 18-20 March, Göttingen, Germany: <http://bit.ly/CODATA-RDM-Symposium>

- The event will feature invited talks and c.50 selected presentations. It will result in a Special Collection of the Data Science Journal providing an overview of current activities to enhance research data management in Universities and research institutions.

**SciDataCon 2018, part of International Data Week 2018**, 'The Digital Frontiers of Global Science', 5-8 November, 5-8 November, Gaborone, Botswana: <http://internationaldataweek.org/> and <https://www.scidatacon.org/IDW2018/>

- International Data Week 2018 brings together SciDataCon 2018, the international research conference for all matters to do with data science, research data management and data stewardship (organised by CODATA and the World Data System), and the 12th Plenary Meeting of the Research Data Alliance.
- International Data Week will be a major event for the global Open Science, data science and research data community. On the agenda will be the role of data in the sustainable development goals, the emergence of FAIR data, the evolution of scholarly communications, the need for data skills in education and - in sum - the many issues related to Open Science / Open Research, globally and in Africa.

  - Call for abstracts will be released 1 March 2018
